

Regional highlights from the 2017 BC Child Poverty Report Card – Capital

In **Capital**, **8,850 children** are living in poverty: close to **one in six children**. Children are at greater risk of poverty than the overall population of the region. Lone-parent families are particularly vulnerable: child poverty rates are more than **five times higher** for children in lone-parent families than children in couple families. (Source: Statistics Canada, 2015 data)

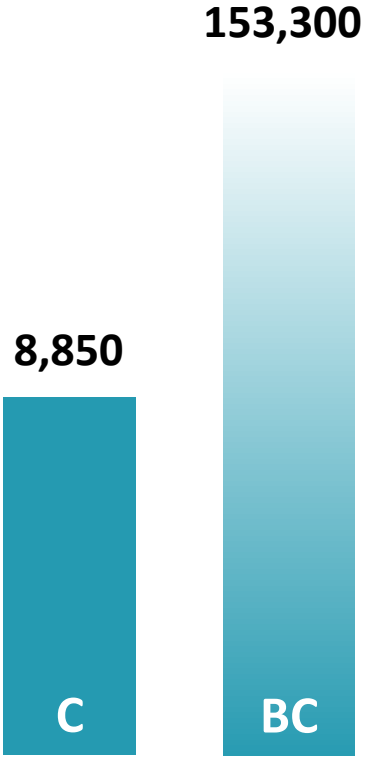

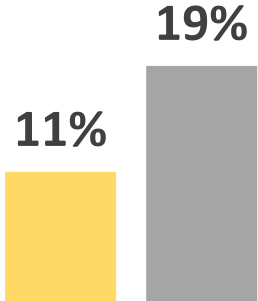

Comparison of Capital Regional District to British Columbia

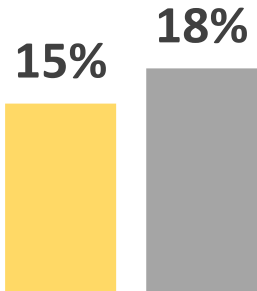
No. of Children Living in Poverty



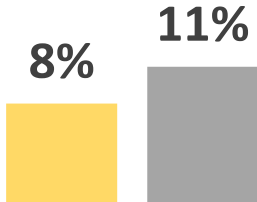
Poverty Rate for all Residents
