

Regional highlights from the 2017 BC Child Poverty Report Card – Central Coast

In **Central Coast**, **390 children** are living in poverty: close to **one in two children**. Children are at greater risk of poverty than the overall population of the region. Lone-parent families are particularly vulnerable: child poverty rates are more than **two times higher** for children in lone-parent families than children in couple families. 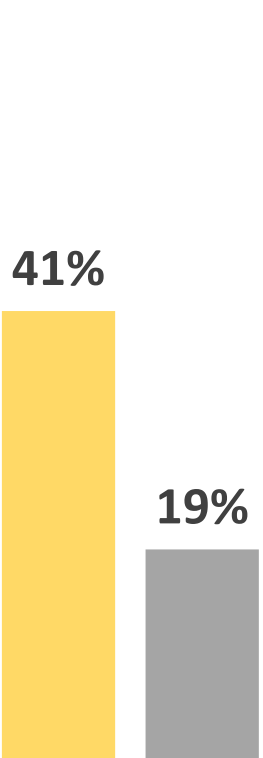

Comparison of Central Coast Regional District to British Columbia

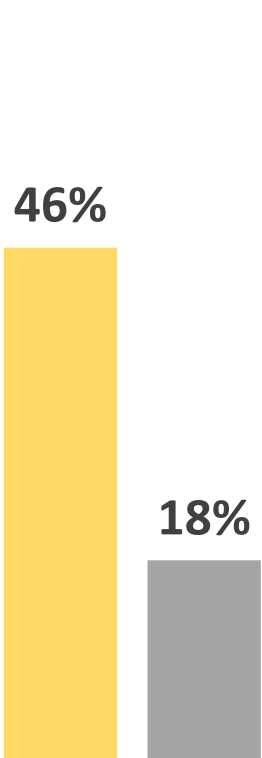
No. of Children Living in Poverty



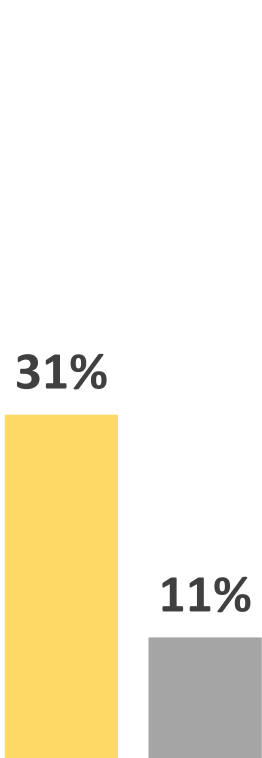
Poverty Rate for all Residents



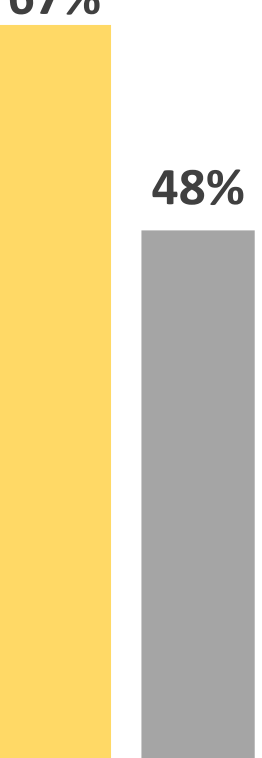
Poverty Rate for all Children
